LENTEN MESSAGE 2016 FROM BISHOP ROBERT McGUCKIN

Ash Wednesday ushers in the Season of Lent, a special time when we are called to grow in our response to the Lord's call to love one another. It is a time of prayer, of fasting and of alms giving.

His Holiness Pope Francis has declared this year a special Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. He has asked that the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God's mercy. He calls us to have an attentive listening to God's word and he is encouraging the initiative "24 Hours for the Lord" on 4-5 March.

In addition to the special *24 hours for the Lord* on the above dates, I ask parishes, where possible, to each week have an hour of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, a special time of prayer. May we pray for our needs and the needs of our world. Please also pray for vocations to the priesthood and to the religious life.

As Pope Francis says, God shows himself ever rich in mercy, ever ready to treat his people with deep tenderness and compassion. God's mercy transforms human hearts, it enables ours, through the experience of faithful love, to become merciful in return.

In Lent then by stepping aside for time in prayer we will grow in the love of God in our friendship with Jesus and be more finely attuned to the Spirit of the Lord, opening ourselves to the power of Grace. May we be alert to opportunities of need and be so prompted to act in a spirit of mercy and compassion.

Project Compassion gives us an immediate means to assist our sisters and brothers mostly in need of vital commodities, that each day we simply take for granted. The call for us to fast can be a very positive thing for ourselves and then by our contributions to *Project Compassion* we assist others.

I am indeed heartened by the young people in our schools who are ambassadors for *Project Compassion*.

I commend the Lenten programs that are being offered in our parishes. By participating in such programs there is the realisation that Lent is not a journey we undertake alone

The call on Ash Wednesday was that we turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel. If Pope Francis can call himself a sinner then we too should see our need for forgiveness and be ready to receive the mercy that God continually offers us. The Diocesan Liturgy Office has sent to Parishes the ritual for the Sacrament of Penance during Lent. Parishes will offer this Sacrament during Lent and we should all take that opportunity to be reconciled to God and to one another.

Pope Francis has expressed his hope that "the Christian people may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy; that this will be a way to reawaken our conscience, too often grown dull in the face of poverty, and to enter more deeply into the heart of the Gospel where the poor have a special experience of God's mercy".

May Lent be for all of us, a favourable time by listening to God's word and by practising the works of mercy.

THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

Recently, Pope Francis discovered during an Audience attended by 7000 that only about 20 raised their hands when he asked if they remembered or could recite The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. He said "we must teach this to the faithful again, which is so important". He reminds us we will be tested on them on judgement day. Let us reclaim some of the treasures of our faith by "learning" and understanding the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. Teach them to your children and in our Schools.


The Corporal Works of Mercy are to

feed the hungry
give drink to the thirsty
clothe the naked
welcome the stranger
visit the sick
visit the imprisoned
bury the dead.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are

counsel the doubtful (instructing) instruct the ignorant (advising) admonish sinners (consoling) comfort the afflicted (comforting) forgive offences (forgiving)

bear patiently those who do us ill (bearing wrongs patiently) pray for the living and the dead (praying)



SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

In this Jubilee Year of Mercy and during the season of Lent, rediscover and appreciate anew the beauty and importance of the Sacrament of Penance. The First Rite of Reconciliation is available in St. Joseph's Church (in the Reconciliation Room) prior to the weekend Masses – Saturday 5.50-6.20PM and Sunday 7.50-8.20AM or any other suitable time by contacting Fr. Brian or Fr. Lino. Two weeks before Easter we will also have the usual Second Rite of Penance – date to be finalised.

WHAT IS EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT?

Just as you can sit or kneel in the Church and feel and experience the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist in the Tabernacle (and can pray some prayers of petition or thanks), for Exposition the host is placed in the sacred vessel called a monstrance (meaning 'to show forth') so you are able to see the consecrated host which we refer to as the Blessed Sacrament. During Exposition, we are in the presence of the Risen Jesus in the Eucharist.

Why not make a special effort during Lent to come for some time of prayer and adoration from 4.30PM-5.25PM prior to the 5.30PM Mass in St. Joseph's Church on Friday.

As the Psalmist says "taste and see that the Lord is good".

PROJECT COMPASSION

The **theme** of **Project Compassion** 2016 is "Learning More, Creating Change". As Pope Francis says "Education is an act of hope", so this year's Project Compassion focuses on the power of learning and the many ways in which Caritas Australia is working with its Caritas partners around the world to provide vital learning and renewed hope to children, women and men most vulnerable to extreme poverty and injustice.

In this week's story on the envelope we meet Dooney in Malawi in East Africa. This is her story:

Malawi in East Africa is one of the poorest countries in the world. Most people rely



on farming small plots of land to produce food to feed their families. But many, like Doney and her family, have often gone months without enough food to eat.

Yet, when Caritas Australia and the local Caritas, CADECOM (the Catholic Development Commission in Malawi), began working in Doney's remote village, they saw beyond the community's challenges. Together they identified the community's strengths,

and each family created their vision for a healthier, more sustainable future.

CADECOM worked with Doney's community to harness their natural resources. Families were trained in new farming techniques, and already they're producing more plentiful crops. "The problem of malnutrition in my household is an old song now," says Doney. CADECOM also worked with the community to install a borehole so Doney and her family now have access to clean water, dramatically improving their health.

Doney's passion for education was recognised as a strength of the community, so she received training as an Adult Literacy Facilitator through the CADECOM program, and is now teaching adults in her village.

These days, the people of Doney's village have access to clean drinking water, flourishing crops and are building their knowledge to create a better future. "My life has been transformed," smiles Doney.

"The village is developing... I would like to thank the people of Australia. The support you provide to us is going to the right people, and is helping us."
