THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE BEFORE EASTER

An important part of our preparation for Easter is to celebrate the Sacrament of God's loving forgiveness and healing – the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation.

There will be the usual **Second Rite of Penance** in St. Joseph's Church

THIS TUESDAY 15th April 10AM & 7PM

We prepare together with Prayer, Scripture, Hymns and Examination of Conscience and then have the opportunity to go to one of the three Priests for **Individual Confession and Absolution.** Two Priests (Fr. Brian and Fr. Lino) will be available at the 10AM celebration, and they will be joined by Fr. Terry Hickling from Warwick for the 7PM celebration.

So that the celebration is not overly long, it is important to understand the difference between celebrating the First Rite and the Second Rite of Penance.

- # In the **First Rite of Penance** when you personally prepare and go individually to the Priest, there is more time for you and the Priest to share, if you desire some guidance.
- # With the **Second Rite** it is different. All the preparation has been done together with many prayers and Scripture readings all that remains is for you to approach the Priest and just say:

Father, it is (so long) since my last Confession. I ask forgiveness for these sins (briefly mention sins for which you seek God's forgiveness).

The Priest will then give you a penance, ask you to say a short act of contrition and give you absolution. All else is omitted. There is not time for advice or a conversation as might happen if and when you celebrate the First Rite of Penance.

After all have received Sacramental Absolution, there will be a prayer of thanksgiving, followed by the Blessing and Rite of Dismissal and the Recessional Hymn.

The three Priests will stand as we have done in previous years.

It is essential to be brief in the confession of your sins and only essential to mention serious sins for which you seek God's forgiveness. Mention some less serious sins but be brief so that the celebration will not be overly long.

Celebrating this Sacrament while there are three Priests available and before Holy Week is strongly recommended.

Celebrating this Sacrament while there are a number of Priests available (this Tuesday) and before the Triduum commences on Holy Thursday is strongly recommended.

CHRISM MASS: Parishioners are invited to join (in person or in spirit) with Bishop Robert McGuckin and the Priests of the Diocese in St. Patrick's Cathedral on Monday 21st March at 5.30PM for the Consecration of Chrism and the Blessing of the Holy Oils for use in the Sacraments for the next year.

- **† Holy Chrism** is used in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Ordination of a Priest.
- **†** The Oil of Catechumens is also used in Baptism and to anoint adult Catechumens preparing for Baptism.
- † The Oil of the Sick is used for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The Holy Oils will be received into our Parish at the Mass of The Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening.
