#### POPE BEATIFIES BLESSED PAUL VI, THE 'GREAT HELMSMAN' OF VATICAN II

VATICAN CITY: "By our apostolic authority we declare that the Venerable Servant of God Paul VI, Pope, shall henceforth be called Blessed..."

With these words, Pope Francis beatified Paul VI at the closing Mass of the Synod of Bishops. Then Sister Giacomina Pedrini, a member of the Sisters of Holy Child



Mary, carried up a relic: a bloodstained vest Blessed Paul was wearing during a 1970 assassination attempt in the Philippines. Sister Pedrini is the last surviving nun who attended to Blessed Paul.

The celebration comes at the conclusion of a two week meeting where the Pope, along with Bishops and Cardinals from around the world, discussing the challenges of the family.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, who was made a Cardinal by the newly Blessed in 1977, was present at the beatification. He was greeted warmly by Pope Francis at the start of the Mass. Benedict XVI had declared Paul VI 'Venerable' in December 2012.

Pope Francis wore a gold chasuble that belonged to Blessed Paul VI as well as the newly beatified's, pastoral cross.

The Holy Father reflected on the Synod, noting that pastors and lay people worked together "in order to help today's family walk the path of the Gospel with their gaze fixed on Jesus."

"It has been a great experience, in which we have lived synodality and collegiality, and felt the power of the Holy Spirit who constantly guides and renews the Church," he said. "For the Church is called to waste no time in seeking to bind up open wounds and to rekindle hope in so many people who have lost hope."

The Pope expressed his hope that the Holy Spirit would continue to "guide the journey which, in the Churches throughout the world, is bringing us to the Ordinary Synod of Bishops on October 2015."

## Paul VI: A Prophetic Witness of Love

Referring to Blessed Paul VI as a "tireless apostle", Pope Francis recalled his predecessor's establishment of the Synod as a way of adapting to the "growing needs of our times".

"When we look to this great Pope, this courageous Christian, this tireless apostle, we cannot but say in the sight of God a word as simple as it is heartfelt and important: thanks!" he exclaimed as the faithful applauded. "Thank you, our dear and beloved Pope Paul VI! Thank you for your humble and prophetic witness of love for Christ and his Church!"

During his pontificate, Blessed Paul VI led the Church during the sexual revolution of the 60s. It was in that time that he wrote his famed encyclical "Humanae Vitae" (Human Life) which reaffirmed the Church's

# **SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS - SATURDAY 1<sup>57</sup> NOVEMBER**

Mass for the Solemnity Of All Saints this Saturday is at 7AM in St. Joseph's Church (not the Chapel).

From the beginning, the Church has honoured and revered its martyrs and heroes. Those who were referred to as Saints in the early centuries were proclaimed Saints by the people who knew them – unlike the rather lengthy process that is followed today before a person is canonised. Francis of Assisi in the 13th century was proclaimed a Saint one year after his death.



In the early Church, Christians would celebrate the anniversary of a martyr's death for Christ each year at the place of martyrdom. In the persecution of the infamous Emperor Diocletian, the number of martyrs became so great

that a separate day could not be assigned to each. Believing that every martyr should be remembered and venerated, **Pope Gregory IV (827-844) declared All Saints Day a feast for the entire Church** to be celebrated on **1**st **November**. The Lord, who has worked in a wonderful way in the lives of the Saints, is ready to work in us if we will turn to Him and surrender our lives to Him.

## FEAST OF ALL SOULS - SUNDAY 2<sup>ND</sup> NOVEMBER

# Masses for All Souls Day Saturday Vigil 6.30PM & Sunday 8.30AM & 5.00PM

All Souls Day is unique on the liturgical calendar. Neither a solemnity nor a feast, this commemoration outranks other feasts and even takes the place of a Sunday in Ordinary Time, as it does this year. Prayer for the dead reaches deep into our human history and it has been our custom from the earliest days of the Church. The belief that our prayers can be of assistance to the dead is a treasured tenet of our Catholic faith. We profess it every time we recite the Nicene Creed: "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." The Lectionary provides many options for readings on this Sunday. All the texts proclaim the centrality of the Paschal Mystery in understanding the meaning of Christian death: because of Jesus' Death and Resurrection, death leads to new life for all those united to Christ. Therefore, because of our faith in the Risen Christ, we can find hope in death.
