THIS IS APPROPRIATE FOR ANY TYPE OF GRIEVING:

- Be gentle and take time for yourself: have a longer bath/shower, go on walks, sit in a warm nurturing space, visit special places you connect with your loved one, breathe deeply.
- Give yourself time to remember, to look at photos, to share stories, to laugh and cry.
- Create a memory book or a memory box; create or build a special memento to your loved one: a garden, a CD, photo album or DVD.
- Be with people you are comfortable spending time with in conversation or in silence.
- Involve yourself in some light activity: golf, walking, fishing.
- Prepare for special days and holidays with your family/friends.
   Christmas, birthdays and anniversaries can be difficult times. Plan a visit to the cemetery, light a candle or maybe spend some time at the person's favourite place.
- Make resolutions for new and renewed directions in your life and in the life of your family.
- Keep a journal. Fill it with your thoughts and memories. Take time to reflect and think.
- Avoid increased use of alcohol, smoking, prescription medication and other drugs; avoid too much coffee and tea to help you sleep at night.

#### GRIEF AFTER THE DEATH OF A PET

When a person you love dies, it's natural to feel sorrow, express grief, and expect friends and family to provide understanding and comfort. Unfortunately, the same doesn't always hold true if the one who died was your companion animal. Many consider grieving inappropriate for someone who has lost "just a pet." Nothing could be further from the truth.

People love their pets and consider them members of their family. Caregivers celebrate their pets' birthdays, confide in their animals, and carry pictures of them in their wallets. So when your beloved pet dies, it's not unusual to feel overwhelmed by the intensity of your sorrow.

Animals provide companionship, acceptance, emotional support, and unconditional love. If you understand and accept this bond between humans and animals, you've already taken the first step toward coping with pet loss: knowing that it is okay to grieve when your pet dies.

## Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy

The Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy begins on 8th December 2015—the 50th anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council—and concludes on 20th November 2016.



Pope Francis will open the door of St Peter's Basilica to officially welcome the Jubilee Year. He has said that the door will become "a Door of Mercy through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons, and instils hope."

The Jubilee Year's theme is: "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful."

A jubilee year is a special year called by the church to receive blessing and pardon from God and remission of sins. The tradition started about 700 years ago and 26 jubilees have been celebrated since. Of those, only three have been "extraordinary" (including this Year of Mercy).

The official proclamation (bull of indiction) of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy is entitled *Misericordiae Vultus* ("The Face of Mercy") and explains how in Jesus Christ, in His words and actions, the mercy of God has been revealed.
